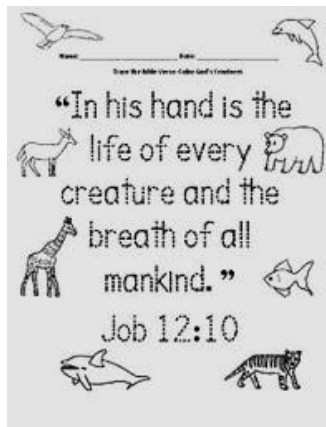

In the Community

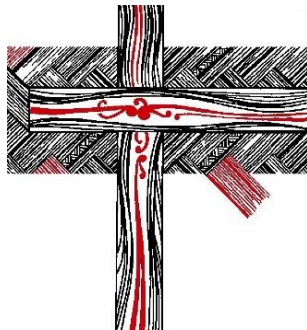
